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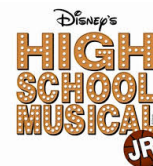

On April 25th, SPSL reached the mountain top of school accreditation when we received the news that we had been recommended for accreditation by AdvancED, a non-profit organization, that conducts rigorous, on-site external reviews of Pre-K-12 schools and school systems to ensure that all learners realize their full potential. This organization serves 34,000 schools and school systems in more than 70 countries, positively impacting the school experience for 20 million students. The accreditation status ensures that SPSL will continue to pursue a school

improvement plan that is reviewed every five years by AdvancED.

Our external visit last April was the culmination of a long process, filled with fits and starts, that began shortly after achieving Rule 10 accreditation from the State of Nebraska in 2011. The next four years saw the SPSL faculty spend countless hours collecting documents, examining data and determining the school's performance in five different standards. These standards covered the school's vision and purpose, its governance and leadership, the teaching and learning that takes place, the monitoring and documentation of student performance and whether the school has the resources and support necessary to ensure achievement for all students. In addition, the teachers honed their instructional skills using an AdvancED tool that looks at the classroom learning experience in seven separate classroom environments. These environments include an equitable learning environment, an environment with high expectations, a supportive learning environment, an active learning environment, an environment that monitors student progress and provides feedback, a well-managed learning environment and the digital learning environment.

The external visit confirmed what we have known for many years, SPSL is an exceptional learning institution. Notable among the findings was the fact that the faculty scored significantly above network averages in all seven classroom environments; this is a quantitative validation of the qualitative impression that SPSL features an excellent faculty that facilitates a superior classroom learning experience for all learners.

The faculty is to be commended on their willingness to shoulder the added responsibility of pursuing this accreditation initiative along with the responsibilities of providing our students with an excellent education. A special recognition goes out to Emily Klassen, our 4th grade teacher, who undertook the massive task of compiling an electronic portfolio for the storage of our important school artifacts and to Joyce Gubbels for her determined support of school improvement.

SPSL, through the efforts of hundreds of people who kept climbing despite the obstacles and setbacks, has reached the mountain top of accreditation and should now be able to clearly see a future path that will keep SPSL at the summit of the Catholic school experience.

DUKE UNIVERSITY'S TALENT IDENTIFICATION PROGRAM



Duke University in Durham, NC sponsors a Talent Identification Program (TIP) for seventh grade students. In order for a student to qualify, they must score at or above the 95%ile on the standardized Terra Nova Tests in the math, science, language, reading, social studies or total composite area. This past school year, 32 of our 85 seventh grade students (38%) met these criteria. Fourteen of

these students chose to take the ACT or SAT Assessment that is primarily designed for above-average high school students in the eleventh and twelfth grades. Out of these 14 students, six of our students are invited to a State Recognition Ceremony at the University of Nebraska at Omaha in May for their outstanding work on these assessments. CATHOLIC SCHOOL MATH CONTEST

This year St. Pius X / St. Leo School had the opportunity to participate in the National Catholic School Math League Contest. Four separate tests were given during the course of the year. Participants included students from 5th through 8th grade. Our school had amazing results, most notably as the top school in Nebraska for 6th grade math as well as for Pre-Algebra.

Of special individual note was Alex ten Bensel placed in the top 4%

nationally in 5th grade, Trevor Gregg was in the top 2% nationally and the top student in Nebraska for 6th grade, Evelyn Brown was in the top 10% nationally, Will Brewster ranked in the top 1% nationally in Pre-Algebra, Isabela Weber was in the top 6% nationally and the second highest scoring student in Nebraska in Algebra and Abbie Brewster and Kaleb Brink were in the top 10% nationally in Algebra.

- * Wear loose-fitting, lightweight and light-colored clothing.
- * Cover windows that receive a significant amount of sun with drapes or shades to help keep your house cool.
- * Weather stripping and proper insulation will keep cool air inside your home.
- * Cool beverages are good for cooling down the body, while alcoholic drinks can impair the body's ability to regulate its temperature.

Please notify the school office, 551-6667, if you move during the summer months. We will be mailing a school newsletter with important school information during August and we need your current address for this newsletter to reach you.



If your child will be a kindergarten or seventh grade student next year, or a new student moving in from out-of-state, please remember to have their health physical exams completed **prior to the first day of school** and return the forms given earlier this year for this purpose. If your child is an incoming new student to our school we will need a copy of his/her baptismal certificate (unless baptized at St. Pius X or St. Leo Parishes), a certified copy of the birth certificate, and a current, completed immunization record from your doctor's office. Call the school office, (402) 551-6667, for any forms you may need.

If you did not pay your book and materials fee, registration fee, technology fee and tuition in full by May 5th or have not signed up to use the SMART Program, the balance is due in the school office by August 1, 2017. **You can mail your payments to the school (6905 Blondo St, Omaha, NE 68104).**

The school office will be open most days during the summer from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. (with a lunch break) but there will be days/weeks when it is closed.
