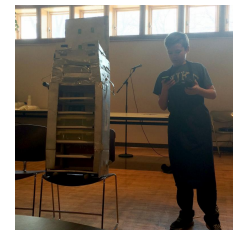
Congratulations to the 7th and 8th grade S.A.M.E. members for their outstanding performance on March 17 at the engineering competition at UNO.
