We have two teachers and our sacramental coordinator who are retiring after many years of dedicated service to the young people of our school community. We are so grateful for their sharing of their time, talents and treasures with our SPSL community.



Ms. Peg Lowndes has been a teacher in our school for 38 years. She came to our school in the 1978-1979 school year, teaching for 3 years in 4th grade and then the next 35 years in 5th grade. Before she came to us, Peg Lowndes taught for 4 years at St. Joseph's in Salix, lowa and two years at St. Bridget's School here in Omaha. Ms. Lowndes graduated from Briar Cliff College in Sioux City, lowa with a B.A. in Sociology and Elementary Education, and, over the years taken several graduate level classes to always stay current with her education.

During her 38 years in our school, Peg Lowndes was not only a teacher of students, but also, for many years was our Religion Coordinator and then our 5th grade coordinator. We thank Peg Lowndes for her gift of ministry to the students of our school.



Mrs. Paula Holder has been our 8th grade science and literature teacher since she joined our school



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faculty in 1985. Mrs. Holder came to us after teaching at St. Patrick's Catholic School in McCook, Nebraska for a couple of years. Not only did Mrs. Holder agree to be a teacher for 8th grade but at the same time she also agree to be the Grade Coordinator for the 8th grade. This is a huge task to undertake especially when you start teaching at a new school at the same time. The 8th grade coordinator is in charge of all of the extra things that happen with our 8th grade

students such as the outdoor education at Camp Kitaki; the 8th grade going to the special CSW Mass at the Cathedral; the graduation practices; the lunch and bowling after practice and then the Graduation Mass and Prayer Service that evening. Mrs. Paula Holder and her husband, Brent, have been married for nearly 38 years. They are the parents of Kyle, Morgan and Tanner. Paula was voted by her fellow teachers to receive "The Sister Brigetta Burns 'Teacher of the Year' Award" at the First Annual SPSL School Recognition Dinner on April 20 of this year. Mrs. Holder leaves a legacy of teaching 31 years in SPSL.

### **DRESS DOWN DAY - FRIDAY, MAY 13th**



Friday, May 13th has been designated an 'Optional Dress Down Day' to support both the St. Pius X and St. Leo Parish Festivals. The proceeds from the dress down day will help the organizers of the festivals purchase prizes for game booths, as well as help with other areas. The St. Pius X festival will be held on Sunday, June 5th. The St. Leo festival will be held on Sunday, September 11th. If students would like to dress down, they should bring <u>at least</u> one

dollar on Friday, May 13th, otherwise they should wear the full school uniform.

"Dress down" means casual attire including jeans, sweatpants, shorts, t-shirts, sweatshirts and blouses. We ask that the t-shirts are in good taste without offensive language/graphics. They may not display musical groups, advertise drugs/alcohol or display guns, weapons or violence. Sleeveless shirts and bare midriffs are not allowed. Jeans and sweatpants must be without holes and tears. If leggings are worn, they must be accompanied with an extra long sweater, blouse or skirt. Flannel pants and/or pajama pants may NOT be worn. We recommend that students not wear any clothing that is too tight or too short. As with any school day, the sock, shoe and jewelry code are in effect, except that the students are allowed to wear any color of socks and any shoes that have the heels and toes closed. # DUKE UNIVERSITY'S TALENT IDENTIFICATION PROGRAM

Duke University in Durham, NC sponsors a Talent Identification Program (TIP) for seventh grade students. In order for a student to qualify, they must score at or above the 95%ile on the standardized Terra Nova Tests in the math, science, language, reading, social studies or total composite area. This past school year, 26 of our 92 seventh grade students (28%) met these criteria. Sixteen of these students chose to take the ACT or SAT Assessment that is primarily designed for above-average high school students in the eleventh and twelfth grades. Out of these 16 students, nine of our students are invited to a State Recognition Ceremony at the University of Nebraska at Lincoln in May for their outstanding work on these assessments. ### **BACKPACK SAFETY AWARENESS**

More than 79 million students in the United States carry a backpack [1].

Many loads negatively impact posture and increase risk for back injury (i.e. musculoskeletal issues, nerve compression, poor posture) [1] According to U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in 2013, 22,000 strains, sprains, dislocations, and fractures occurred from backpacks [2]. About 55% of students' backpacks are heavier than the set guidelines [3]. The American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA) has set some guidelines to assist with the school-wide initiative of backpack safety education [5].

- A child's backpack should not weigh more than 10% of their body
- It is best to pack heavy and larger items towards the back of the backpack
- Make sure items going to and from school are "necessary" items
- Wait to fill up his/her water bottle until they get to school or home
- Carry awkward or heavy items outside the backpack
- If consistently heavy and placing a strain on your student's back, consider a rolling backpack to decrease the load.

Occupational therapists are well suited to address backpack safety awareness. Many safety education programs including demonstrations, brochures, and discussions have occurred in schools all over the United States [4]. We look at factors (i.e. poor backpack wearing) that may be negatively impacting students ability to participate in the things they need to do, want to and are expected to do during the school day [6].

Every third Wednesday in September, schools and occupational therapists all over the United States host backpack safety weigh-in days to bring awareness to students, teachers, and parents. They are a lot of fun and all ages have benefited from the information at these events.

The following are some tips to keep in mind when choosing backpacks for next year:

- Look for a backpack with two straps that are padded and adjustable
- A backpack with good back support
- Chest and/or waist straps to disperse the load
- The bottom of the backpack should fit in the curve of a student's lower back
