Shane knew he was going to be Accepting No For An Answer. He looked at Jenny and said, "Okay." He realized that he should not argue, whine or pout because he could always calmly ask for a reason later if he didn't understand why she refused to loan him money.



When Jenny began to say that Shane was "always" asking her for money, he knew How To Disagree Appropriately. He looked at her. They tried not to look at the group, and they stayed focused on eating their meal even when John, Catherine and their friends encouraged them to throw salsa and napkins on the floor. Jenny and Shane knew they should report the behavior to a nearby adult.

Suddenly, Shane laughed and began to throw his pita chips and napkins on the floor. He sometimes found it difficult to control his behavior in stressful situations even when he knew he should. Shane quickly noticed that the other students at the table, including Jenny, were not happy with his behavior. They told him to stop. Then, Shane told himself to stop and think about what he was doing, a strategy which helped him correct the behavior that appeared to make his classmates uncomfortable. When Shane began to clean up the mess that he made, he noticed that his new behavior made the other students in his group smile. "What a great friend!" the group thought to themselves, because Shane was Self-Correcting his Own Behavior.

Jenny and Shane's group behaved so well that the people from Ronko's called the school to tell the principal that the students were excellent role models. John and Catherine's group behaved so poorly that the people from Ronko's called their parents! When Jenny and Shane heard that news, they were very happy that their social skills worked outside school as well as at school. The rest of their meals at Ronko's were very enjoyable.



DRESS DOWN DAY

There will be a Dress Down Day on Tuesday, November 24th. "Dress Down" means casual attire including t-shirts, jeans, sweatpants, sweatshirts and blouses. We ask that the t-shirts are in good taste without offensive language / graphics. They may not display musical groups, advertise drugs/alcohol or display guns, weapons or violence. Sleeveless shirts and bare midriffs are not allowed. Jeans and sweatpants must be without holes and tears. Girls may wear leggings, but they must be accompanied with an extra long sweater, blouse or skirt. Flannel pants and/or pajama pants may NOT be worn. We recommend that students not wear any clothing that is too tight or too short. Shorts are not "In Season" so may NOT be worn. HEALTH HINT: When is my child too sick for school?

The following are guidelines (from the VNA office) to assist you in deciding when your child should stay home from school:

- Fever of 100 degrees or higher your child should be fever-free for 24 hours without the use of medication before returning to school.
- Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea - keep your child at home for the duration of these symptoms.
 Be sure he is able to tolerate food without difficulty before returning to school.
- Nasal secretions and coughing / sneezing - spread respiratory infections easily when these
