GARDENING & MORE IN THE CLASSROOM

In 6th grade the students will be planting seeds in recycled seed-starter pots representing the following three categories: food, herb and flower. The seeds will be sprouted in a minigreenhouse in the science lab, and later the students will take them home for transplanting. The students will also be hatching chicks and talking about the surge in the popularity of backyard chickens. On a larger scale, the 6th grade unit will cover the benefits of urban gardening including health benefits, reduction in fossil fuel use and benefits to the local economy. The students will investigate the impact of the potential Keystone XL pipeline to Nebraska farms and ranches.

In 8th grade, the students will be designing and building a self-sustaining garden ecosystem complete with plants and fish, and/or a self-sustaining terrarium. They will also investigate the importance of the honey bee on our food sources, and the impact of bee Colony Collapse Disorder (CCD).

Did you know that St. Pius X and St. Leo Parishes have community gardens? St. Pius X has 12 plots that are each 4×12 feet in area but the garden has room for expansion. The charge is \$35 per plot/year. Contact Sandra Peaslee for more information on the plots (renner1@gmail.com). St. Leo Church has 40 plots that are 13 x 13 feet each in area. The cost is \$30 per plot/year. Sign ups are available at the end of March/early April and are publicized in the church bulletin. What a great way to grow the food we eat! A team of 7th and 8th grade S.A.M.E. students are working on a greenhouse design in the hopes that it will someday be built on SPSL property.
