Technology Information:

IXL: Have you heard your student say something like, "I need to do 20 minutes of IXL"? IXL is an online program that students can use to practice certain academic skills. Each grade has different academic subjects (like math and language arts) broken down into individual skills



(like "Add fractions with unlike denominators" or "Identify sensory details"). When a student shows mastery of one skill, IXL will recommend new skills that build upon the student's knowledge. Also, whenever a student uses IXL, the teacher receives a report telling them what skills the student worked on, for how long, and how many correct responses they had. This helps teachers benchmark students and determine the next best steps. You can learn more about IXL at their website here.
