For many years, classrooms were filled with teachers of orders. and religious our school was tuition-free. With the change to lay faculty, parent-paid tuition became a central source of funds to operate our school, and tuition has increased as the cost of a



Catholic education rises each year.

Tuition and fees for the 2023-24 school year are \$3,800 per student while the actual cost to educate a student at our school is \$7,190. Approximately 30% of SPSL students qualify for free or reduced lunch under federal guidelines. Parents continue to pay as much tuition as they are able, and our two parishes (St. Pius X and St. Leo the Great) continue to provide significant financial support, yet 40% of our families need tuition assistance.

You can help! The Education Partners program at SPSL matches willing donors with students in need. Will you become a partner in education with a SPSL student? If you can do so, please return the enclosed envelope with your donation to help with tuition for a student in need. A gift of \$100 would cover a week of tuition at SPSL. Any amount is helpful!

Your contribution is entirely anonymous, and the student's family is simply told that a generous donor has assisted the student financially. A few times a year you will receive a note from your student partner updating you on his/her progress.


