The Events for Speech are Original Oratory, Declamation, Poetry, Oral Interpretation of Drama (OID), Duet Acting, Humorous Interpretation (HI), Dramatic Interpretation (DI), Extemporaneous (Exemp), and Impromptu. The most common of these events is Duet Acting because it is fun to do with a partner. The least common is Extemporaneous because you only have 30 minutes to prepare your speech and need to deliver a few minutes long speech. There are 56 students on the speech team this year and they are all doing a great job.

Mrs. Martinez, the current speech coach, told us about how she became the speech coach: "I actually chose to be the drama coach, and it just came with the speech coach job as well. Back in 2004 when I first got hired to coach, I was going to school as a theater major at UNO and saw the posting on our call board in the theater. I had a ton of drama experience but had never done speech. It was terrifying and exciting and addicting to coach students to use their speech gifts. There have been a few years I have not been able to coach speech because of the demanding hours, but I really love watching students grow through their pieces."


