Tuition and fees for the 2024-25 school year are \$3,925 per student, while the actual cost to educate a student at our school is

\$7,572. Approximately 30% of SPSL students qualify for free or reduced lunch under federal guidelines. Parents continue to pay as much tuition as they are able, and our two Parishes continue to provide significant financial support, yet 40% of our families need tuition assistance.
